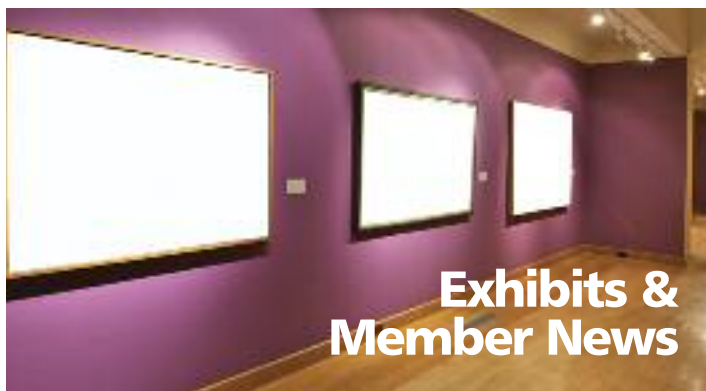
From Sara Becker, VP Programs

Here's a tidbit from one of the artist's that we heard about. We viewed a painting by the super-realist and sculptor, Audrey Flack called, "Marilyn". From her book Art & Soul, Notes on Creating, Flack starts off with her credo:

*I believe in art.
I do not believe in the "art world" as it is today.
I do not believe in art as a commodity.
Great art is in exquisite balance. It is restorative.
I believe in the energy of art, and through the use of that energy, the artist's ability to transform his or her life and, by example the lives of others.
I believe that through our art, and through the projection of transcendent imagery, we can mend and heal the planet.*
